ANNUAL CONFERENCE

17 — 19 DECEMBER 1979 AT THE UNIVERSITY OF KEELE Annual conferences of the British International Studies Association are designed to analyse major themes and issues which affect the international community. The purpose of such conferences is to incorporate an array of disciplines, from politics, economics and history to sociology and law, in order to seek a better understanding of the present and future international system.

This year's conference will include senior diplomats and academics from the Middle East, the United States and Western Europe to consider four themes. *Aspects of the Middle East* will include consideration of recent events in diplomatic history as well as future development patterns in that region.

Under the heading of *International Negotiations: Theory and Practice*, speakers will assess the value of recent innovations in bargaining techniques used in large-scale negotiations, the implications of the Strategic Arms Limitation Treaties, and the theory and reality which underlie the negotiating process. Sessions concerning *International Resource Problems* will include "Resource Dimensions of Conflict in Southern Africa," "International Law and Resource Conflicts," and "Resource Problems and Opportunities Among Developing Countries."

The fourth major theme of the conference, *International Law and Organization*, will deal with new considerations of international law as "the raw material" of international relations, reassessing traditional approaches to governments in exile, and analyses of the Nuremberg trials and of the statesman, Friedrich von Gentz.
