On registration, you will be provided with your conference folder, conference badge, up-dated information as to the time and place of meetings, meal tickets, and details of transport arrangements. Late arrivals will be able to register at the Conference Office [Room 144] throughout the conference. The conference office will be open from 9:00 am on Tuesday and Wednesday.

MEALS AND SOCIAL EVENTS

Breakfast can be taken at Hatfield College between 7:30 and 9:00 am, and at St Aidan's between 7:30 and 8:30 am.

Lunch will be available on Tuesday and Wednesday from 12:30 - 2:00 pm at Hatfield College. In addition there will be a cold buffet in the JCR adjacent to the bar. The bar will be open from 12 - 2 pm.

Dinner will be at Hatfield College on **Monday** night at 7 pm. This is preceded by the Publishers reception in Elvet Riverside, rooms 143 and 149 from 6 to 7 pm.

On **Tuesday** the conference dinner is at Van Mildert College beginning at 8:00 pm. This will be preceded by the Vice Chancellor's reception, from 7:30 to 8:00 pm.

There will be wine on sale from 6-7 pm in the JCR on Monday at Hatfield College and from 7 pm in the bar at Van Mildert on Tuesday. Late bars from 6:30 - 12:00 am on Monday at Hatfield and from 7 pm - midnight on Tuesday at Van Mildert.

Tea and Coffee will be served between 10:30 - 11 am and 3:30 - 4 pm in rooms 143 and 149.

Bars

The bar at Hatfield College will be open from 6:30 pm to 12 am on Monday the 16th. Wine for dinner will be on sale from the adjacent JCR before dinner. There will be 'no smoking' bar at Hatfield College which will be sign posted.

On Tuesday the bar at Van Mildert College will be open from 7 pm to 12 am. Wine for dinner will be on sale from 7 pm in the bar and the adjacent shop.

For Lunch and Dinner you must produce the appropriate meal ticket.

In this package you will find an envelope containing a colour coded ticket for each meal. Please present them to the helpers before entering the dining room. There is very little flexibility in the catering system, this means that if someone takes a meal they have not booked someone who has paid for a meal will go without. If you want a meal and have not booked and paid for one, please see Pauline Kelly or buy one from room 144. Otherwise you may choose to buy sandwiches go to a nearby restaurant.

Guest Lecture

There will be a talk after dinner on Monday the 16th, by Matt Ridley, beginning at 8:30 pm. This will be in Elvet Riverside Lecture Theatre 201.

PARKING

Parking space in Durham is extremely restricted. Limited parking space will be available at Hatfield College (20 spaces) and St Aidan's College (80 spaces); but delegates should avoid bringing cars to Durham if at all possible. There are excellent public transport facilities, and a certain amount of transport has been provided for delegates as part of the conference arrangements. There are regular buses from New Elvet (where the Conference Centre is) to South Road (near St Aidan's); but most of Durham is easily and pleasantly walkable.

TRANSPORT

Monday 16th: Mini buses from St. Aidans to Elvet Riverside beginning at 3:30 and operating a half hourly service till 5:30 pm. *All buses will leave St. Aidans from the Reception/Porters Lodge area.*

In the evening a half hourly service from 9:30 pm till midnight from Hatfield back to St. Aidans.

Tuesday 17th: Mini buses from St. Aidans to Elvet Riverside starting at 8:30 am and running till 9:30 am.

In the evening there will be coaches from Elvet Riverside to St. Aidans/Van Mildert. These will run at approximately fifteen minute intervals. The schedule is as follows: 6:00 pm, 6:15, 6:30, 6:45, 7:00, and the last coach at 7:15 pm. This will allow you to return to your various abodes to refresh yourselves before the reception and dinner. *Due to the large number of participants we hope that you will not all rely on the last possible coach.*

After dinner there will be a mini bus service from Van Mildert to Hatfield beginning at 9:30 pm with the last bus leaving at midnight.

Wednesday 18th: Mini bus service from St. Aidans to Elvet Riverside at 8:30 am, 8:45, 9:00 am. Then 9:30 and 10 am.

In general there are three minibuses operating so the service should be pretty continuous. There will obviously be periods when the demand for them is great, for example in the morning. It will be important then that the buses leave at the advertised time. In the evenings the demand is likely to be more sporadic. The bus drivers will try to wait till the buses are more or less full before leaving.

OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION

Newspaper: There will be newspapers on sale at breakfast in the colleges.

Banks and Post Office: There are sub-branches of Lloyd's Bank, Barclay's Bank, the National Westminster Bank and the Midland Bank in New Elvet, within fifty yards of the Conference Centre. The main branches of all these banks are in the Market Place, a five-minute walk away from the Conference Centre. The Post Office is in Silver Street, just off the Market Place.

Insurance: Subject to their statutory rights the University will accept no responsibility for accidents to delegates while on its property, or for damage to, or loss of, their personal property. Delegates are requested to reduce the risk of theft by not leaving valuables unattended on University or College premises.

Medical Services: The nearest hospital with an accident and emergency department is Dryburn Hospital, tel: (0191) 3332333. Conference staff will be able to help with GP's (University Health Center, 42 Old Elvet, ext. 7675) and dental services (Burrows & Newton, 18 Old Elvet, Tel.: 3848231) if necessary. Please note that 'Boots' Pharmacy is the closest (5-minutes walk) at the city center.

Smoking: For reasons of health and safety, the University of Durham has a policy of "no smoking" throughout all University buildings. Visitors are asked to comply with this policy.

Pubs: Durham has a number of pleasant pubs. Delegates may care to visit **The Brewer and Firkin** in Saddler Street (food and wine available); **The Shakespeare**, also in Saddler Street; **The Market Tavern** in the Market Place (good pies and ales; highly recommended); **The Swan and Three Cygnets** on Elvet Bridge; **The Half Moon** in New Elvet; and **The Dun Cow** in Old Elvet. A choice of restaurants can be found in Saddler Street and the Bailey.

Sports and other facilities: There are squash and badminton courts available at the University Sports Centre at Maiden Castle. There will, however, be a charge for using them (£5.00 per court for squash and £4.00 per court for badminton), and players will have to provide their own balls, shuttlecocks and racquets. The booking office (tel: extn. 3456) is open between 9:30 and 11:00am, 2:00 and 4:00pm, and 6:00 and 8:00pm.

University Libraries: Delegates to the conference may, if they wish, consult books in the University Libraries at Stockton Road and Palace Green and use the libraries' facilities for reading and private study. They will be asked to show some identification and to sign the Visitors' Book.

Telephones: There are coin-box and card telephones in Elvet Riverside and in the Colleges.

PLACES OF INTEREST

Durham's celebrated Norman Cathedral and Castle are both within two minutes' walk from the Conference Centre and almost on the doorstep of Hatfield College. Close to St Aidan's College is the Oriental Museum, Britain's only collection devoted exclusively to Eastern art treasures, including jade, ceramics and ancient writings. Delegates may also wish to visit the Botanic Garden behind Collingwood College, and the Museum of Archaeology in the Old Fulling Mill on the river bank, containing local discoveries from Roman and Medieval times.
