Organisation of the Conference

The Conference proceedings will be conducted almost exclusively in two buildings - the Refectory Building and the Pevensey Building - which are within three minutes walk of each other.

Whilst the location of the BISA Conference Office, the Publishers' Exhibition and the Paper Sales Room, along with the serving of all all meals and refreshments will be on Level 2 and Level 3 of the Refectory Building, all panel sessions will be held in the Pevensey Building.

In addition, two events - the Conference Lecture by Prof. Michael Nicholson, and the BISA Annual General Meeting - will be held in the Chichester 1 Lecture Theatre and Arts 2 Lecture Theatre respectively.

You will find a map of the campus, with all these buildings marked, on the inside back cover of this document.

BISA Conference Office and Registration Desk

The BISA Conference Office will be maintained in the Blue Room, Level Three, Refectory Building. Any queries regarding the organisation of the conference, matters of information and so on should be directed through the BISA Conference Office.

In addition, the **Registration Desk** will also be situated in the Blue Room from 6.00pm on Monday, and throughout Tuesday and Wednesday.

Each room has been assigned a Panel Assistant who will be able to help Panel convenors and other conference delegates in the event of any queries or problems.

Refreshments will be served between sessions in the Terrace Room, Level 3, Refectory Building.

Paper Sales Room and Photocopying

Conference Papers will be sold throughout the conference from the Paper Sales Room which is to be found in the Green Room, Level 3, Refectory Building.

Papers will be sold at £1.00 for papers up to twenty pages in length, and at £1.50 per paper of twenty pages or more.

Photocopying of papers at the conference is not free, however photocopying of papers can be paid for and arranged through the Conference Office.

Other Facilities

As well as the 24-hour security desk at the York House reception, information and advice regarding campus facilities and local transport information can be found at the Information Desk on the ground floor foyer of the Refectory Building.

A number of shops and banks can be found in the Refectory Building or close by. The University Bookshop, newsagent, general shop, and coffee shop are on the ground floor of the Refectory Building.

A branch of the Midlands Bank/HSBC can be found at the north end of the Refectory Building, and a Lloyds ATM just outside the Refectory Building. There is a Barclays Bank at the south end of the campus on the ground floor of Sussex House.

The bar booked for BISA Conference delegates, including a late licence (1.00 am), is the Grapevine Bar which can be found on Level 2 of the Refectory Building, opposite the Laines Restaurant.

There are a number of other bars on campus which are open to conference delegates. These are all within a three or four minute walk of the Refectory Building and include the IDS bar, and East Slope bar, Falmer House Bar, the Gardner Arts Centre bar. The latter two bars also serve food.

Transport and Travel

The University of Sussex is served very well by public transport with its own railway station at Falmer and with many bus routes beginning or terminating at the Refectory Building on campus. We strongly encourage you to use public transport whilst at Sussex University.

By Train - There are frequent rail services between Brighton (and Lewes) and Falmer (the Sussex University station).

Delegates should reconfirm the accuracy of these times before travelling.

From campus you should follow the signs to Falmer station through the underpass which crosses the A27. A five minute walk from Refectory Building and York House will see you at Falmer station.

By Bus -

The No.25 leaves Churchill Square to the University every ten minutes until 3pm, then at 10 minutes past, 30 minutes past and 50 minutes past each hour. Last bus to campus at 11.30pm. This bus stops and leaves at the Refectory Building. Last bus from campus at 11.01pm.

Those delegates booked into the Grand Hotel will find the Churchill Square bus stands five minutes walk from the hotel. Alternatively this bus can be picked up at the Old Steine stops next to Brighton Pavilion, again five minutes from the Grand Hotel.


