WELCOME TO BISA 2002

On behalf of the Department of International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science and the national BISA organisers (Pauline Kelly, Christine Worrall, Justin Morris, Richard Little and Emma Mayhew), we welcome you to the 2002 conference of the British International Studies Association.

The LSE International Relations Department is particularly delighted to host the BISA conference for the first time in this, our 75th anniversary year. Although International Relations had been taught at the LSE before, it became properly established when the Department was founded in 1927 and Philip Noel Baker's chair was sponsored by Montague Burton in 1930. The Department now has 28 full-time staff, plus two Tutorial Fellows, and hosts over 500 students each year. Past members of the Department such as Geoffrey Goodwin and Susan Strange were deeply involved in establishing BISA in the early 1970s, and our current colleagues include three past BISA chairs, Barry Buzan, Chris Brown and Chris Hill, two past editors of *Review of International Studies*, Paul Taylor and Mick Cox (who joins us in January), and a number of committed BISA members.

With 80 panels and more than 200 papers, the 2002 programme is rich and diverse, catering to the enormous breadth of interests BISA represents. Topics range from the theoretical to the more practical, from the strategic to the economic, from the regional to the global and from the contemporary to the historical. In the plenary lecture in the Old Theatre at 6 pm on Monday 16th, Professor Michael Cox will address whether we have 'Unfinished Business? International Relations after the Cold War'.

The full and rich programme, the publishers' exhibition and the social life of the conference will, we hope, leave you some time to enjoy the multiple attractions of the LSE and the area of London in which it is located. The LSE has been undergoing a face lift (you will no doubt come across a few building sites which indicate that it is still a work in progress). Apart from acquiring new buildings such as Clement House and Tower One, the centrepiece of the LSE's new look is the British Library of Political and Economic Science renovated in 2001 by Norman Foster. Covent Garden is a stone's throw from the LSE, the South Bank is not much further and the National Gallery is down the Strand. In short, if you need a break from your intellectual endeavour, good food, amusement and culture are within easy reach.

In case you need directing around the LSE or pointing in other directions, you will find PhD students available to help you. We wish you a stimulating conference and a wonderful time.

ORGANISATION OF THE CONFERENCE

The conference - all panels, lectures, committees, meetings and catering - is centred in two buildings: Clement House and the Old Building, about five minutes from each other (see map). Overnight accommodation is provided in the Rosebery Hall of Residence (25 minutes walk from the LSE), the Thistle Bloomsbury Hotel (ten minutes walk) and the Thistle Islington Hotel (short taxi ride).

The main conference proceedings will take place in Clement House. The Conference Office, Publishers' Exhibition and Paper Sales Room are all located in Clement House.

The **Restaurant** where lunches will be served is located on the 4th floor of the Old Building. This building contains a bar (Beavers Retreat). Pubs and bars can also be found within short walking distance from the LSE.

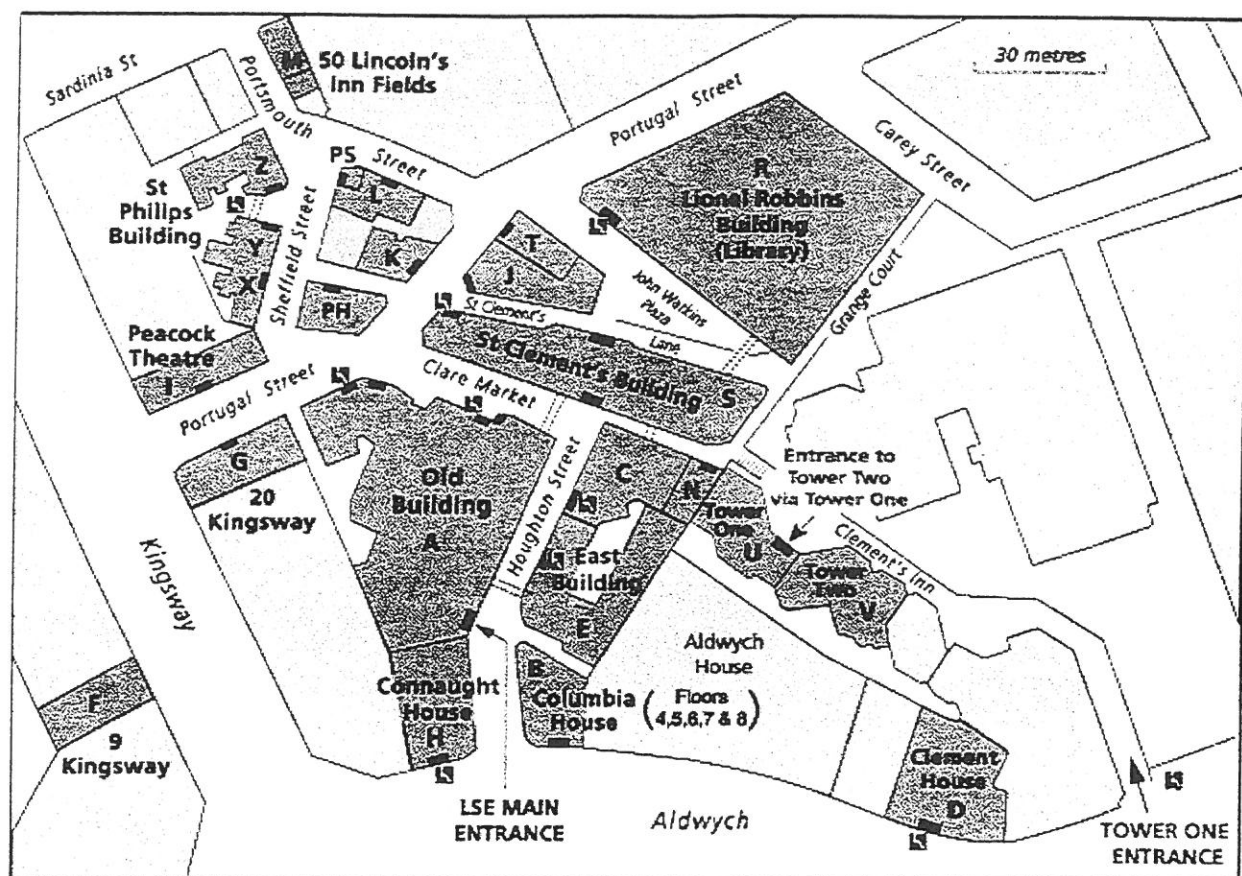

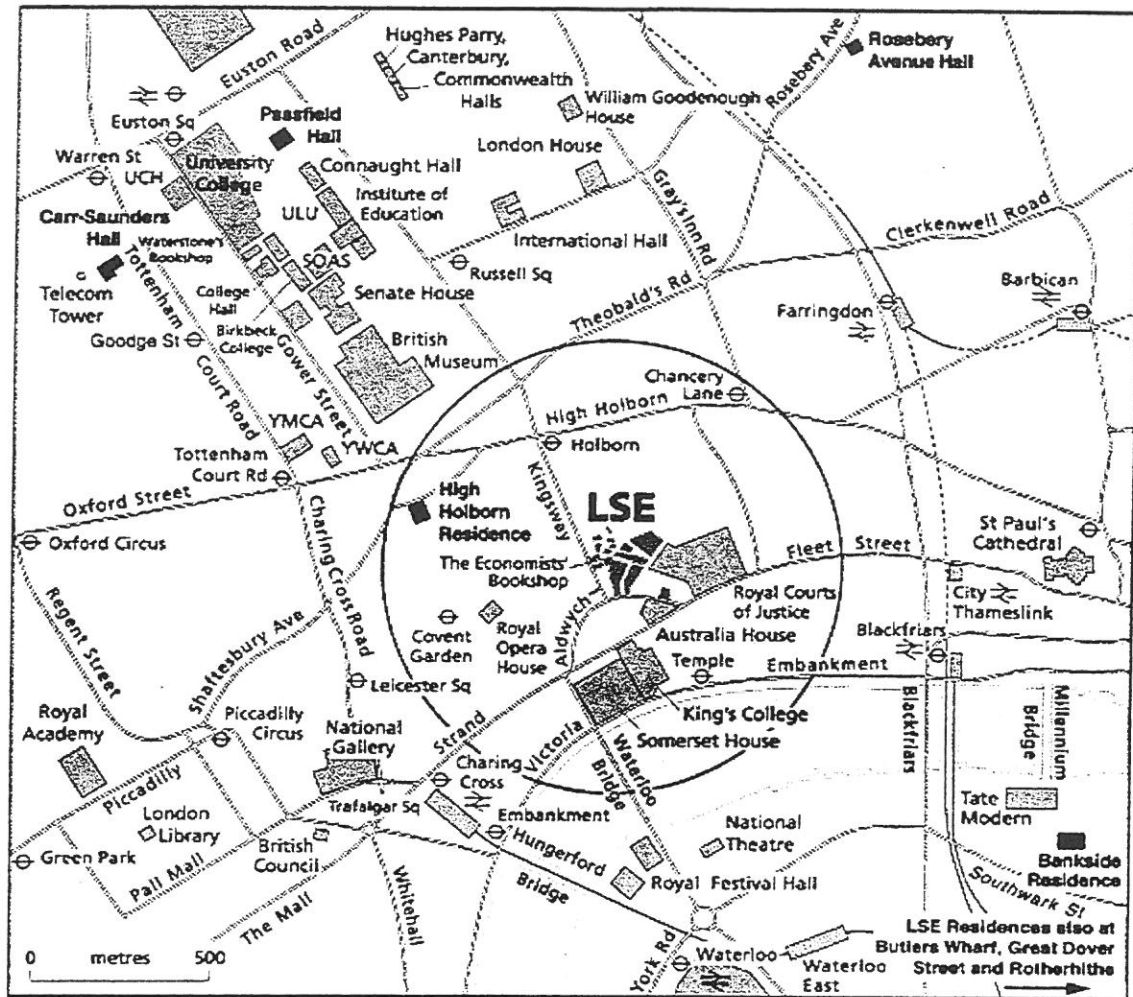
